## Suspension of Public Celebrations

Bishop Michael Duca of the Diocese of Baton Rouge has announced the suspension of public celebrations of Sunday and daily Masses in all parishes and Catholic institutions in the diocese effective Tuesday, March 17, 2020.

The suspension is in effect until further notice. There are over seventy church parishes and other Catholic institutions in the 12 civil parishes that comprise the boundaries of the diocese. Additional details on how this decision will affect the celebrations of sacraments and other aspects of parish life will be determined and communicated in the next few days. As always, priority consideration will be given to the directives of Governor Edwards and to public health officials who have our best interests in mind. The Bishop said, "Let us pray that the Holy Spirit gives us a spirit of Hope in the Lord, who will sustain us even in these unprecedented times."

## Why is Mary called the New Eve?

In Genesis we read the story of Adam and Eve being tempted by the devil and submitting to him as they chose to disobey God and eat the apple. But the hope in that story arises from God's promise to save us in Genesis 3:15. This verse reads "I will put enmity between you and the woman, between your seed and her seed; he shall bruise your head and you shall bruise his heel."

In the New Testament we see that Mary fulfills this prophecy as the mother of Jesus, because it was her seed, Jesus, that crushed the head of Satan by conquering death on the cross through resurrection. The crucifixion can be seen as a mere bruising of Jesus's heel.

There are other correlations between Mary and Eve: both were virgins, pledged to a man, both were visited by an angel (in Eve's case, a fallen one), and both made an important decision in response to the angel which helped bring about the actions of the man: Eve listened to the serpent and led Adam into sin; Mary listened to the angel Gabriel and helped bring our Savior into the world.

Mary is also like Eve in that they were both gifts from God. God gave Eve to Adam to be his helper and she was so close to him that she was bone of his bone and flesh of his flesh. God gave Mary to John, to take into his home forever and in doing so God gave Mary to each one of us and she is so close to us that we can be a home she dwells in and she can be a dwelling place for us as well.


Mary in the New Testament is a fulfillment of the Old Testament. She is our new Eve, one who does follow God, saying yes to all that God asks and never giving in to the temptations of sin. Hence, in the book of Revelation, Mary is described as a woman in battle with the ancient dragon, which is another name for the serpent in Genesis.

St. Irenaeus of Lyon, one of our early Church Fathers, wrote "the knot of Eve's disobedience was loosed by the obedience of Mary. For what the virgin Eve had bound fast through unbelief, this did the virgin Mary set free through faith." (Against Heresies, III.22.4)

Mary, help me to have unwavering faith like you!

## How Music is Chosen for Mass

Throughout its history, the Church has sought to preserve the beauty of the Liturgy for the edification of her people. Church documents testify to this care and witness to the fact that the Church's regard for music has maintained a steady course, promoting new music that proceeds organically from existing forms and reigning in those musical practices which turn the minds of the faithful towards secular or profane themes and away from the Divine and Holy Sacrifice celebrated at Mass. These principles found in the official documents of the Church are reviewed here and are those followed when music is considered for use during Mass:

1. Sacred music is for the glory of God and the sanctification and edification of the faithful (*Sacrosanctum Concilium* 26)).
2. Sacred music should consequently possess, in the highest degree, the qualities proper to the liturgy, and in particular sanctity and goodness of form (*Tra Le Sollecitudini* 2).
3. It must be holy, and must, therefore, exclude all profanity [secular] not only in itself but in the manner in which it is presented by those who execute it (*Ibid.*).
4. The introduction into the celebration of anything that is merely secular, or which is hardly compatible with divine worship, under the guise of solemnity should be carefully avoided (*Musicam Sacram* 43).
5. Instruments that are generally associated and used only with worldly music are to be absolutely barred from liturgical services and religious devotions (*Ibid.* 63).
6. Gregorian chant should be given pride of place in liturgical services (*Sacrosactum Concilium* 116).
7. There must be no innovations unless the good of the Church genuinely and certainly requires them, and care must be taken that any new forms adopted should in some way grow organically from forms already existing (*Ibid.* 23).

Pope St. John Paul II, Pope Benedict XVI, and Pope Francis have all reaffirmed upholding the treasury of the sacred music of the Church alongside contemporary compositions, using Gregorian Chant as the "first model" (Clark, 2019). In his recent address to the Scholae Cantorum of the Italian Santa Cecilia Association, Pope Francis confirmed the music suited to the Liturgy:

Not just any music, but holy music, because rituals are holy; endowed with the nobility of art, because God must be given the best; universal, so that everyone can understand and celebrate. Above all, clearly **distinct and different from that used for other purposes.**

Most importantly, Pope Francis urged musicians to remember that the liturgy is the "first teacher of catechism." As such musicians must take great care in choosing music for the Liturgy and ask these questions of each hymn considered:

- 1 • Is the theology in our music truly Roman Catholic?
- 2 • Are we singing scripture or personal thoughts and impressions? (Singing Scripture is the priority.)
- 3 • Are we singing the Mass or singing songs at Mass? (Singing the Mass is the goal.)
- 4 • Regardless of style, is the music and its presentation reverent and prayerful? (Does it orient us to God?)
- 5 • Are we preparing adequately and giving God our best as Pope Francis asks? (Or do we gratify ourselves?)

Musical compositions appropriate for Mass may, therefore, be traditional or contemporary provided they "have the qualities proper to genuine sacred music" (*Sacrosactum Concilium* 121).

## St. Joseph's Family Rosary

Let us join in prayer as a community and Church family during this time we cannot gather together. We are asking that each **Sunday at 8pm** families and individuals pray the Rosary in their own homes. Together we will storm the heavens with our prayers, as we offer intentions for our families, protection from the Coronavirus and all illnesses, healing of those affected and restoration of our Holy Mass.

## Vocation

Roman Catholics in the United States spend a good deal of time speaking of “vocation” and the manner in which each of us discerns our vocation for life. In today’s apostolic letter, however, Peter gives us the “cornerstone” of our vocation, the description of what each of us is called to first and foremost by our baptism. He describes our vocation as “a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of [God’s] own, so that you may announce the praises” of Christ, who called us out of darkness into light (1 Peter 2:9). All of us, no matter what path our life’s vocation may take us down, have been chosen by God, made holy, and anointed as priests in the high priesthood of Christ through baptism. All of this, so that we may announce the praises of Christ.

Vocation is given for proclamation at home, in the workplace—wherever life takes us—in service, in word, and in sacrament.

Here are a few recommended consecration preparation books, most of which are available through heavenlygiftsonline.com, or by calling 985-386-3558:




