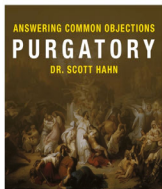

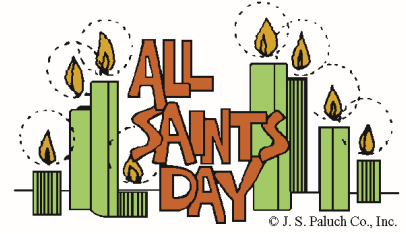

A Compassionate God

Today's reading from the book of Wisdom presents an image of a patient God who "rebuke[s] offenders little by little" (Wisdom 12:2), an image endorsed by the psalmist, singing of how the LORD is "slow to anger and of great kindness, and compassionate toward all his works" (Psalm 145:8, 9). The crowd with Jesus, however, grumbles when they see Jesus's kindness and compassion extended to Zacchaeus, who was not just a tax collector, but the "chief tax collector"—a title that surely emphasizes his standing as a sinner to be scorned. In the second reading, Saint Paul urges the Thessalonians to be "worthy" of God's calling, so that "the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you" (2 Thessalonians 1:12); such people, unlike the crowd in the Gospel, would rejoice at Zacchaeus's determination to change his life after encountering Jesus.

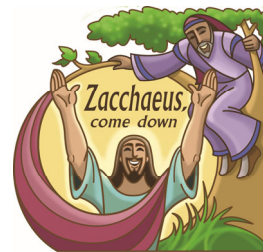

Today's Gospel features the story of Zacchaeus. He is a fun study for a neophyte Christian to meditate upon. Zacchaeus is curious about Jesus, so much so, he goes the extra step of strategically positioning himself in Jesus' path. He humbles himself by climbing a tree, unbeknownst to him, Jesus' future destination. Jesus calls Zacchaeus' name, and Zacchaeus responds joyfully, and accepts Jesus' invitation into his home. Despite the negative "grumbling" of those looking on, Zacchaeus does not desert Jesus, he stands his ground. Lastly, Zacchaeus, without any command from Jesus, gives half of his possessions to the poor. Wow! A RESCUE and RESPONSE moment! It was as if Zacchaeus had been waiting for an invitation. We are probably not going to do much evangelization to tree dwellers, but there is a good chance there are men and women just waiting for an invitation. Or maybe, YOU are Zacchaeus, and are waiting for that opportunity to follow Jesus. If so, how will you respond? It may just be as simple as telling Jesus, "I am ready, pick me!"
