




Stewardship of Finance



Purpose: Tik Tok is an app for creating and sharing short videos. Users can create short music videos of 3 to 15 seconds and short looping videos of 3 to 60 seconds. It encourages users to express themselves creatively through video. Special effects can be added to the videos.

Why Parents Should Be Worried:

Thirteen is the minimum age, but there isn't a real way to validate age so anyone can download the app. Also, parents express concern that there is a lot of inappropriate language in the videos so it's not appropriate for young children. Lastly, by default, all accounts are set to public so strangers can contact your children.

Something New in Christ

Jesus knew that the scribes and Pharisees were trying to trap him. They put him in what seemed to be a no-win situation. Let the woman who was caught in adultery go, and he would have been accused of ignoring the law. Let her be stoned, and he would fail to show mercy toward her, contradicting his life's message. Jesus' response teaches three crucial lessons: none of us is free of sin; we are not the

ultimate judges of others; Jesus is the mercy of God, in whom we can always trust. In Christ, God does something new. When we give our hearts to Christ, we have the hope of new life, a life in which mercy reigns.





Today's Readings



Something Old, Something New

Isaiah 43:16-21 / Phil 3:8-14 / John 8:1-11

"Praise Be Jesus Christ!" This was the greeting you would receive from the Discalced Carmelites would say not long ago, whether in writing, in person or over the phone. Coming from a nun, it doesn't sound so surprising, but what if it came from your tongue? From the tongue of every believer? I'd bet the devil would be beside himself! People might even wonder why you would even say such a thing. Why would you say such a thing? Could you say such a thing? Give an answer as to why you believe, as we profess in the Nicene Creed every Sunday, "in one Lord Jesus Christ"? In today's Gospel, a woman is allegedly caught in the very act of adultery, and will be stoned to death, according to the law of Moses. Talk about despair! Fortunately, the Pharisees did something right, unknowingly, and brought the woman to the only judge in all of creation that can weigh the heart perfectly. Isaiah, in the first reading exhorts, "see, I am doing something new!" The Pharisees escort the woman in with the old law, and Jesus "springs forth" with the new law, mercy! There is a good chance she wants to know who just saved her from certain death. Guess what? Jesus did the same thing for you and I, and together with the woman, we are "Given" new life, and can proclaim— "Praise Be Jesus Christ!" How can we express

mercy in our lives as good Stewards. Giving of our time, talents and treasures toward a ministry is showing mercy towards those in need. Mercy is an ingredient of the kind of love Jesus is asking us to have toward each other.




Easter Lilies






