# Consecration to the Holy Family (Continued from page 1)

### **Prepare**

The word consecration literally means "association with the sacred", and as such it requires a much larger commitment than simply reciting a prayer off of a card. The decision to consecrate your family needs to be intentional and a process through which you completely surrender to God through the Holy Family. You are accepting the truth that salvation history was changed forever by a family, and that through your domestic church, you are called to live their example.

### Suggested steps before praying the Consecration to the Holy Family:

- 1.) Discuss the importance of this consecration as a family and why you are doing it.
- 2.) Participate in the sacrament of reconciliation.
- 3.) As a family, choose something to fast from for at least a week. Refraining from a secular activity can help discipline our minds and hearts to be more focused on God.
- 4.) Prepare for the commitment you are making. Know that consecration to the Holy Family is not a single event. It is choosing a way of life for your family. You and your family are consciously choosing to be a beacon of light of God's love through his Church.



In the Vatican II document Sacrosanctum Concilium we find these words: "The musical tradition of the universal Church is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art." This is so because music, an integral part of Catholic Liturgy, has always fulfilled a dual purpose - it is both formative and expressive. In other words, we sing what we believe and we believe what we sing. This 6-week course will delve into the lives of six saints and Doctors of the Church who defended and spread the Faith through hymnody and other musical forms. We will learn about Saints in the Early Church: St. Ambrose, St. Ephrem, St. Romanos, and St. Kassiani and in the medieval Church: St. Thomas and St. Hildegard of Bingen. 

# Baptismal Death and Resurrection

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, we also honor our own baptism as our initiation into the Christian life and community. In the Gospel, the baptism of Jesus, with his immersion and then emergence from the water, points to his later submission to God at his death, and his emergence from the grave at his resurrection. This pattern of death and resurrection is our path too, as followers of Jesus. Throughout life, often in small ways, we learn to surrender our limited and self-centered agendas. This surrender often feels like death. The sacrament of Baptism ritually enacts this pattern to remind us of Jesus' death and resurrection, so that we too might embrace the deaths and resurrections of our own lives. As Jesus emerged from the water, he encountered his Father and the Holy Spirit.

Like Jesus, we can know we are God's beloved, empowered by the Spirit.

There comes a time when we all face a crisis in our life. In today's world there are crisis all around us and sometime, we have no one to talk to or to help us. Our Stephen Ministers can be the answer you are looking for. Our ministers will be there to listen to you, to let you know you are not by yourself, and they will walk your rocky road with you. You might need a Stephen Minister for several months or maybe a year. It does not matter how long it takes, your Stephen Minister will be with you as long as they are needed.
