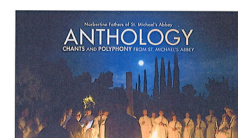

Pope Francis has said the family is the "greatest treasure of any country," and urged the faithful to protect and strengthen it.

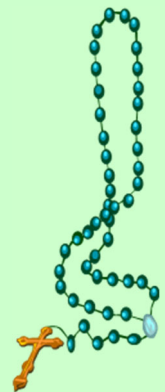

The Singing Body of Christ

The *choir* sings the Entrance Antiphon; all listen and reflect. The *priest* chants, “The Lord be with you;” the *people* respond, “And with your spirit.” The *organist* intones the “Gloria;” the *people* sing this jubilant hymn. The *cantor* sings the Responsorial Psalm; the *people* respond. The *choir* sings an anthem; everyone listens and reflects. In some instances, a *deacon* may chant the Gospel; all listen and reflect.

As can be seen from these varied examples, many different people or groups of people are responsible for singing the Liturgy. Why might this be? Why are different parts of the Mass given to different people? Why can't the organist also be the cantor? Why do we need a choir?

The simple, but profound answer to these questions is found in St. Paul's Letter to the Corinthians:

12 For as with the human body which is a unity although it has many parts -- all the parts of the body, though many, still making up one single body -- so it is with Christ.

13 We were baptized into one body in a single Spirit, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as free men, and we were all given the same Spirit to drink.

14 And indeed the body consists not of one member but of many.

18 As it is, God has put all the separate parts into the body as he chose.

19 If they were all the same part, how could it be a body?

20 As it is, the parts are many but the body is one.

21 The eye cannot say to the hand, 'I have no need of you,' and nor can the head say to the feet, 'I have no need of you.'

27 Now Christ's body is yourselves, each of you with a part to play in the whole.

When we come together to enter into the Prayer of Prayers, the Mass, we come as the whole unified Body of Christ. Each part of the body has a duty to the others and shares in the joy, hurt, sorrow, and petitions of the others. Lack of any part makes the body incomplete.

In giving each of the parts of the sung Liturgy to a distinct person or persons, therefore, the music of the Mass represents the oneness of the parts of the Body of Christ. Just as the eye cannot say to the hand, “I have no need of you,” neither can the cantor say to the people, or the people say to the choir, or the priest say to the cantor, “I have no need of you,” for all of the parts of the body are needed for the Body to be whole.

Today we discover that the kingdom of God is beyond value, a priceless treasure. Unfortunately, our culture bombards us with things that it believes are priceless treasures—the bigger and better SUVs, anti-aging and anti-balding creams and salves, miracle diets, and so much more. Having a share in God's kingdom and helping to bring about that kingdom are the greatest treasures that we can ever hope to gain.

"Our Families and Our Faith"

"Israel set out with all that was his. When he arrived at Beersheba, he offered sacrifices to the God of his father Isaac. There God, speaking to Israel in a vision by night, called: Jacob! Jacob! He answered, 'Here I am.' Then he said: I am God, the God of your father. Do not be afraid to go down to Egypt, for there I will make you a great nation. I will go down to Egypt with you and I will also bring you back here, after Joseph has closed your eyes.' So Jacob departed from Beersheba, and the sons of Israel put their father and their wives and children on the wagons that Pharaoh had sent to transport him. They took with them their livestock and the possessions they had acquired in the land of Canaan. So Jacob and all his descendants came to Egypt. His sons and his grandsons, his daughters and his granddaughters—all his descendants—he took with him to Egypt."

An alphabetical listing of names in the phonebooks of generations past gave away the farm. Southern Louisiana was largely settled by descendants of the French. Name after French name offered a measure of the region's heritage, just as the offspring of sister nations flavor the legacy of other cities and areas of the country. So many of those adventurous, brave and enterprising individuals left the known for the unknown because they believed the future offered more promise than the present. We rightly celebrate the heritage of those who brought with them the Catholic faith of their families. As the children of Israel were delivered in the nation of Egypt, they brought with them their faith. To the glory of God, our ancestral families did the same.

Saint Martha (first century)

July 29

Whether you find Martha Stewart admirable or annoying, she has the perfect patron saint. Luke describes Martha—saint, not Stewart—as “burdened with much serving” (Luke 10:40). About Mary, seated, listening to Jesus, Martha complained, “Do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving?” Jesus’ response, “Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things . . . Mary has chosen the better part” (10:41, 42), suggests to some the superiority of the contemplative life, leaving the rest of us, supporting families, earning livings, (helping others?), as second-class Christians. But Luke introduces Martha and Mary immediately after Jesus’ parable of the Good Samaritan, whom Jesus recommends as a model of practical compassion, concluding, “Go and do likewise” (10:37). Go and do! Sit and listen! Discipleship is never either/or but both/and. Jesus ministered in prayerful silence *and* hospitable service. Monastic calendars add Martha’s sister, Mary, and brother, Lazarus, calling all three “hosts of the Lord,” recalling their welcome of Jesus to their home in Bethany, reminding us Whom we welcome whenever we extend summertime hospitality! —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J.
