The Gift of the Eucharist

Today we hear how Abram encounters Melchizedek, “king of Salem . . . and a priest of God Most High” (Genesis 14:18). Melchizedek appears nowhere else in scripture, but is nonetheless significant. Psalm 110 declares of the great King David, “You are a priest forever, in the line of Melchizedek,” a description later given (in the letter to the Hebrews) to Christ as High Priest.

Early Christians saw in Melchizedek’s bread and wine the bread and wine of the Eucharist; Paul’s account of the Last Supper (in today’s second reading) is the oldest one in scripture. In the Gospel, Luke describes Jesus providing bread for a crowd in words similar to Paul’s, words still used by the Church: Jesus takes bread, gives thanks, breaks it. Together, these three readings reveal how Christian priesthood, Christ’s Real Presence, and the call to serve those in need are all found in the gift of the Eucharist.

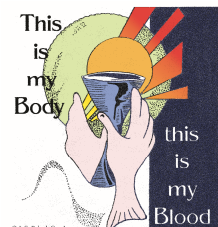

Gn 14:18-20 / Ps 110:1, 2, 3, 4 / 1 Cor 11:23-26 / Lk 9:11b-17

In today's Gospel, we find there are twelve baskets of bread leftover. Jesus turns five loaves of bread into enough for thousands. What did they do with all that leftover bread? Why was there so much bread leftover in the first place? Bread doesn't last that long in the open air. It gets hard, moldy and being out in nature, it attracts all sorts of interested parties. Luke wrote that the bread put into the baskets were fragments, pieces leftover from what those who were present didn't eat. Obviously, they either had their fill or didn't care for the bread recipe. Looking back through the lens of Catholicity, we can see more than bread, we see substance—we see the foreshadowing of the Eucharist and the Eucharist cannot be wasted! Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. We may not have the answers to all the questions above, but we do have *the* answer, so rejoice in the truth, the source and summit of our faith!

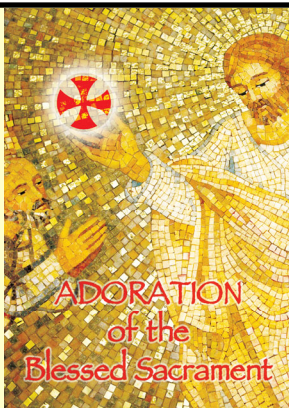
