


LECTIO: THE CASE FOR JESUS

As part of our parish's Total Stewardship program, we renew our emphasis in the vital Stewardship of Finance effort. Five established elements of spiritual giving—Five Giving Principles—guide our study, and will help us express our generosity and our prayerful participation in the work of ministry and service. Those principles include the following:

- 1. Giving is planned. It is intentional and involves decisions made thoughtfully and well in advance.
- 2. Giving is proportionate, a percentage of an individual's or a family's income, no matter how substantial, no matter how modest.
- 3. Giving is sacrificial. Modeled on the Lord's own example, charity summons our best-not after expenses, savings or investments-but first.
- 4. Giving is a free expression of a cheerful heart; it is neither coerced by anyone else, nor is it conditional on anything else.
- 5. Giving is an act of prayer, offered in thanksgiving to a gracious God who has, in Christ, freely given us all things.





In the Desert

Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, and then the devil tested him. Moses and the Israelites had been in the desert for forty years before being led to the land of milk and honey. There were times when they called out to God, sure that, as Saint Paul wrote to the Romans, "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." We sometimes spend time in the desert as well. Not a literal desert most of the time, but a desert in which it seems difficult to perceive God's presence, times when we face difficulty and are tempted to leave God's ways behind. On this First Sunday of Lent, Jesus shows us what to do in these moments: stand firm and trust in God.

Today's Readings

First Reading — The Israelites show their faith by offering the LORD first fruits of the products of their new land (Deuteronomy 26:4-10).

Psalm — Be with me, Lord, when I am in trouble (Psalm 91).

Second Reading — All who express faith in the risen Christ and confess that he is Lord will be saved (Romans 10:8-13).

Gospel — Jesus was led into the desert by the Spirit and was tempted (Luke 4:1-13).

Stewardship Do Not Be Deceived

Deut 26:4-10 / Rom 10:8-13 / Lk 4:1-13

Satan is often called the Father of Lies — the Great Deceiver. In today's Gospel, we see how Satan tempts Our Lord with lies and deceptions only to discover that Jesus is no ordinary man. Sadly, what Satan tried to deceive Our Lord with are the same empty offerings that Satan often uses to this day to tempt ordinary men. Promises of possessions, power, and invincibility are his most common tools of deceit. When the devil had finished tempting Our Lord, he departed from him, for a time. Now obviously, we know that even death on the cross would not bring Satan a victory and that in the end. God proved to be victorious. Truly, we too will be tempted in this life. The world, and the devil, will make us promises that cannot be fulfilled. But God will make promises that will always be kept. For our part, we must strive to resist the allure of empty promises and seek that which is truly good and truly from God. The allure of empty promises will lead us to believe that what God has provided to us in life is ours alone and not to be shared. God calls us to be generous in all aspects of life. He calls us to share what He has given to us in order to build the kingdom of God by bearing much fruit abundantly. The rewards are much greater than we can ever imagine here on earth and in the next life.
