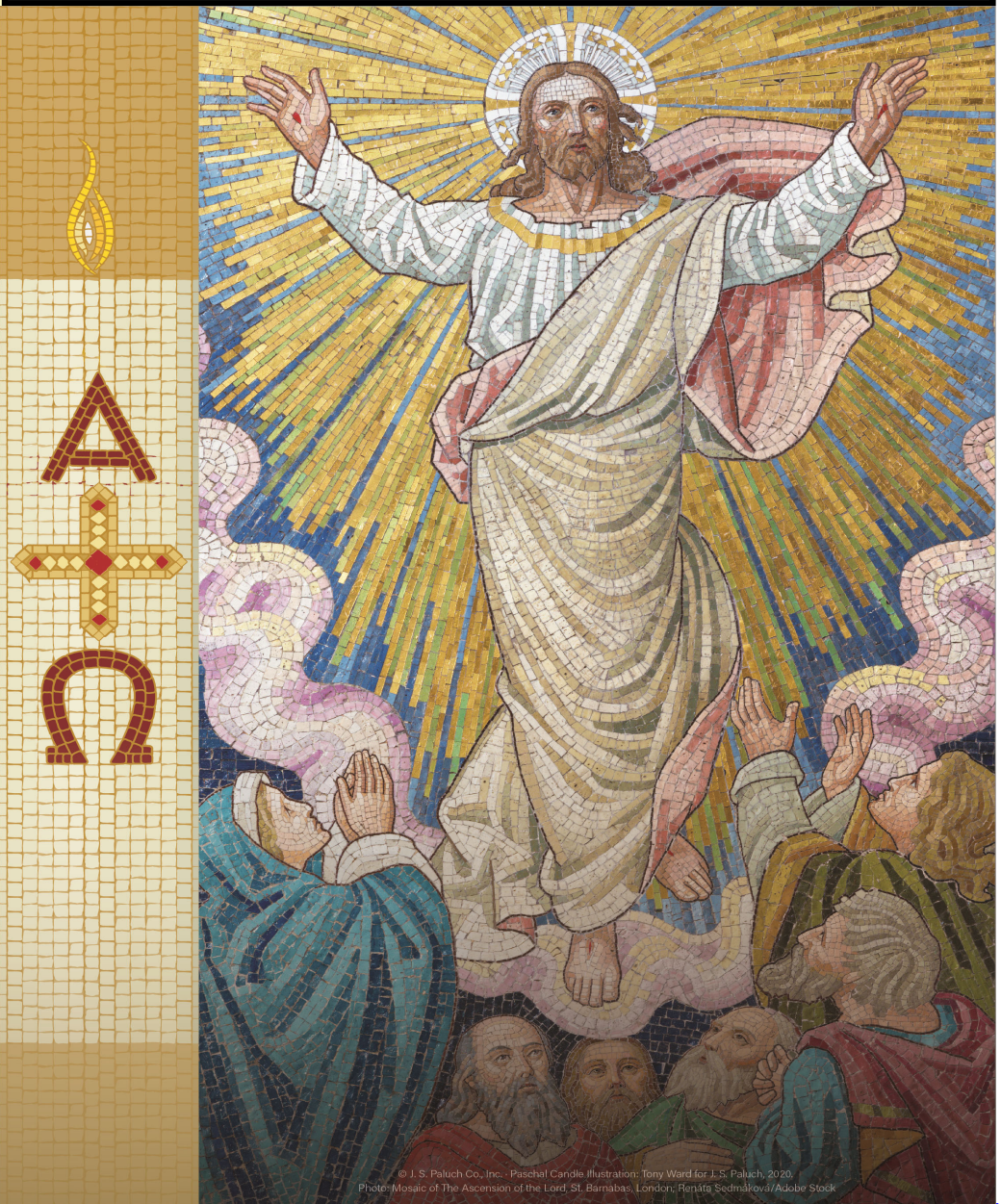

In honor of our Blessed Mother, please either bring a rose to the ceremony, or perform a small act of kindness for someone in need.

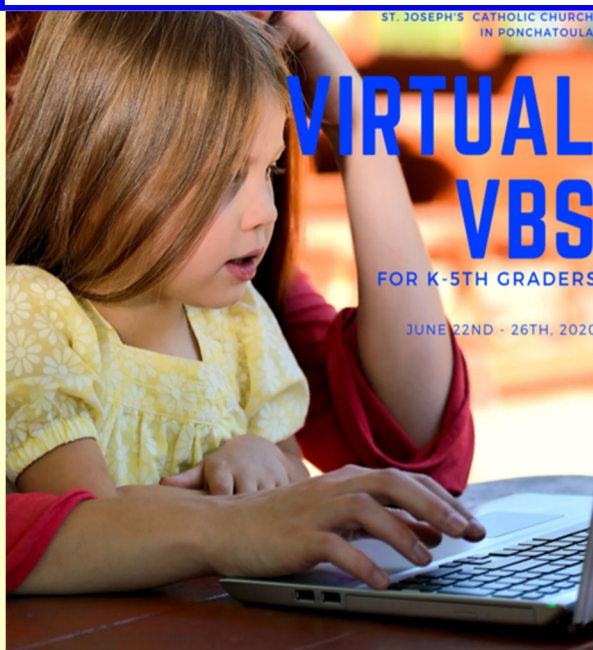
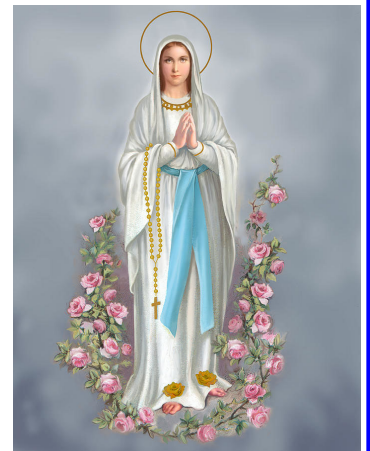
Wear a Miraculous medal to the ceremony.

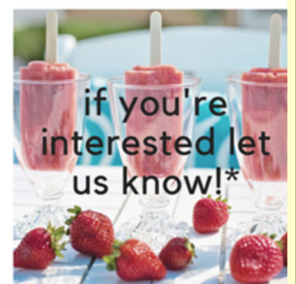
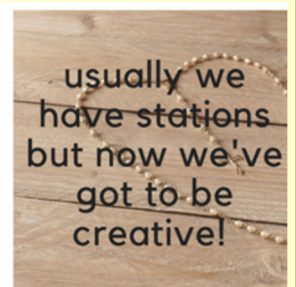

Psalter: Hymns for Life

In these troubled times, look to the Book of Psalms for comfort. The Book of Psalms, the Psalter, consists of hymns that express every human emotion possible. These are hymns that praise and worship the Lord, that thank him and petition him, but also rebuke him in anger, question his silence, and stand naked before him. These are the hymns sung by Israel, by Jesus himself, by the early Christians, and by the Church today.

Fr. Samuel Weber of St. Meinrad Archabbey, who has set all of the Psalms of the Mass to music, has written the following about the beauty and promise of the Psalms:

The Psalter is true to life; it accords so accurately with the rawness of human experience, It leaves nothing unsaid, no emotion unexpressed. ... the pain of living and betrayal by friends (Ps 54[55]), attacks of enemies (Ps 55[56]), the unfairness of a world in which the wicked seem to get rewards, and the just, for all their devoted piety, seem afflicted with endless trouble (Ps 72[73])-it is all there in graphic detail.

But it would not be enough merely to expose pain. More is needed. There must also be a response on the part of the believing heart. It must do something with this pain. It must present it to God! (Ps 63[64]: 1) "Hear my voice, O God, as I complain!"

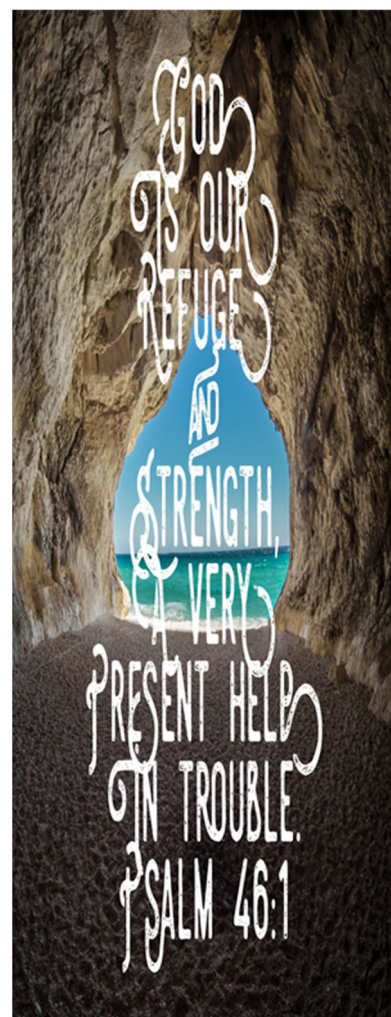
Taking up the Psalter holds a promise. Disorientation is not forever:

"When I think: 'I have lost my foothold,'
your mercy, Lord, holds me up.
when cares increase in my heart,
your consolation calms my soul" (Pa 93[94]: 18-19).

We are not alone in our trouble; suffering, sickness and death do not have the final say. Could this be the reason why so many Christians have clung tenaciously to the Psalter for so many centuries? We need desperately to listen to the psalms, to read them and to sing them, alone and together. To scream, to delight, to weep, to pray them again and again until

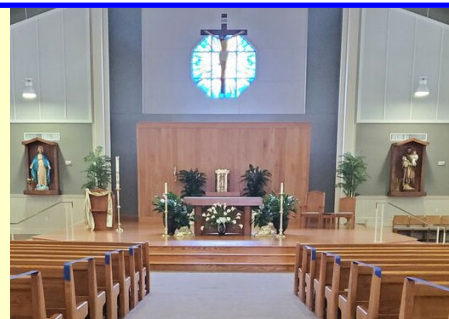
"My body and my heart faint for joy;
God is my possession forever" (Ps 72[73]: 26).

If you take up the Psalter, prepare for an ordeal. Get ready to see the mirror image of your own life in the book your hands hold. Prepare to let the tears flow...and the sighs, and the groans. And that will be good."



Guidelines for Mass Attendance

"Pushed" Out On Mission

There is a delightful character in the original *Dr. Dolittle Tales* called the "Pushmi-Pullyu." It is a beast with two identical halves, with a head at each end. No matter which direction the beast walks, one end is the "push me" and the other is the "pull you." Today's feast is a bit like that in the life of the church. In the book of the Acts of the Apostles, it is the ascension of Christ that calls for the Holy Spirit, which consequently sends or "pushes" the church out on its mission. This is the message that we hear from the angels today as they tell the friends of Jesus not to look up into the clouds, but to get busy. It is the message of Jesus himself in Matthew's Gospel, as he sends them out to baptize. He also tells them, "I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). And it is this message, confident in faith that Jesus has ascended to shouts of joy, that "pulls" us along to our final destiny. The life of the faithful disciple, sent into the world on mission, will one day know the same risen, ascended glory.

"Something Is Missing"

"While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul traveled through the interior of the country and came down to Ephesus where he found some disciples. He said to them, 'Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you became believers?' They answered him, 'We have never even heard that there is a Holy Spirit.' He said, 'How were you baptized?' They replied, 'With the baptism of John.' Paul then said, 'John baptized with a baptism of repentance, telling the people to believe in the one who was to come after him, that is, in Jesus.' When they heard this, they were baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. And when Paul laid his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied. Altogether there were about twelve men. He entered the synagogue, and for three months debated boldly with persuasive arguments about the kingdom of God."

All the way through middle school, Janeen's worn a best friends necklace. Shaped as one half a heart, it's angled center perfectly aligns with the half that hangs around the neck of her best friend Carrie. Clear to anyone who sees either necklace, something is missing. Those who'd been disciples of John the Baptist carried with them only a part of the truth concerning Christ's coming. Paul provided them the rest. His audience had simply been unaware of the potential of the Spirit's presence in their lives. He saw what they couldn't envision, and he made certain to provide it to them, aware something was missing.
