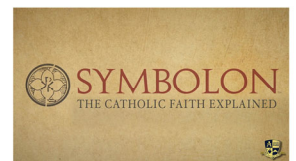

Treasures From Our Tradition

Even though the Easter season has drawn to a close, today's feast still basks in the glow of Easter's twilight. To believe that we are made in the image and likeness of God—a God whose inner life is described in terms of community—is to recognize that we are in relationship with one another. In the language of the liturgy, we do not each stand alone before God, but constantly affirm this truth in the very words of our prayers. "We believe, we offer, we ask you," we say, or "have mercy on us, hear us, listen to our prayer," and in preparation for Communion, we pray the perfect prayer to "Our Father."

To be baptized is to enter into the life of a community of faith. Nowhere is this sense of community more focused than at Sunday Mass, when we respond to the love of the Father by being together in Christ, embraced by the Spirit, for the sake of the world. Today has been called an "idea feast," and impossible to grasp fully. Yet, as the readings today explore, the Trinity is not a concept traced like a triangle on a blackboard. It is the air we breathe, the sign we trace on our bodies as a pledge and promise of God's love.

SAFE HAVEN PARENT WATCH APP OF THE WEEK

PURPOSE: **Whisper-** This 17+ app's motto is "Share Secrets, Express Yourself, Meet New People." It has a similar feel to the now-defunct PostSecret app, which was discontinued shortly after its release because it was filled up with abusive content.

WHY PARENTS SHOULD WORRY: Whisper lets users set up anonymous accounts to make their messages or confessions overlap an image or graphic (similar to e-postcards), which other users can then "like," share, or comment on. While it allows for creative expression, it can also take overly personal content viral. The app also shows a user's location. Although the app is geared toward older teens and adults, younger children are finding their way to it. A 12-year-old girl in Washington was reportedly raped by a 21-year-old man who met her on Whisper

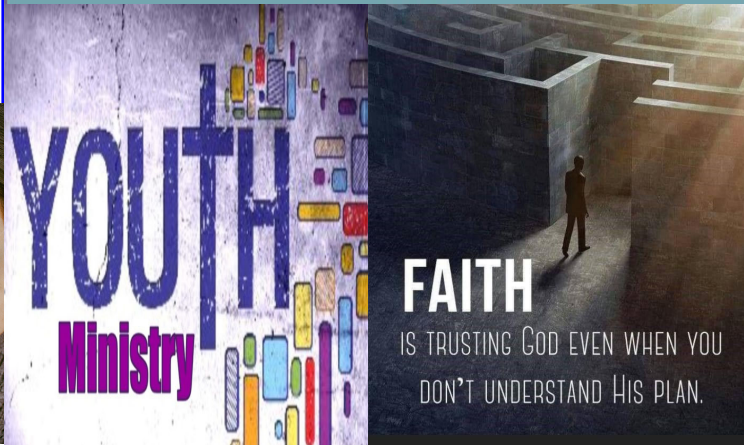

The Mystery of the Blessed Trinity

Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Church sets aside this Sunday to focus our attention on the mystery of the Blessed Trinity, God who is one, but three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The first reading from Deuteronomy emphasizes both God's awesome greatness and amazing nearness. It might seem beyond belief, but the God of all creation speaks to us, protects us, and guides us. The second reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans describes how we are to relate to the three persons who are one God. We are led by the Spirit to meet God the Father as adopted children. Our adoption is such that we are even heirs with our brother, Christ, the second person of the Trinity, in whose sufferings we must also share. “Resurrection Witnesses”

Three blocks from Joanna’s office, the small sedan ahead of her ran the light and was hit broadside by a pickup truck. She saw the light change from yellow to red and knew the student driving the sedan was at fault. When police arrived, the student claimed the light was green. Karen knew better. To the relief of the pickup’s driver, she proved to be an excellent witness. She had seen it happen and could tell an accurate and detailed story.

One of the Ten Commandments addresses the problem of being a false witness. In an oral culture, good witnesses were critically important. In Acts, St. Luke said, “To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name.” In his gospel, he reminded us that the coming of the Christ was long prophesied: “It is written that the Messiah would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations.” And then he noted, “You are witnesses of these things.” Today, we testify to his love for us, as well. In Jesus Christ, we’ve been given life. On Easter, we are contemporary witnesses, celebrating his love.

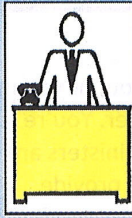

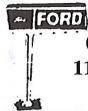
