“God Will Not Let Us Go Hungry”

On his way to the ancient town of Zarephath, the Old Testament prophet Elijah encountered a widow in need. “A widow was there gathering sticks; he called out to her, ‘Please bring me a small cupful of water to drink.’ She left to get it, and he called out after her, ‘Please bring along a crust of bread.’ “I have nothing baked,” she said, ‘as there is only a handful of flour in my jar and little oil in my jug.’ Her plan for the sticks? To prepare a final meal for herself and her son. With nothing left, she expected they would not survive. Through his servant, God had other ideas in mind.

“The flour did not go empty, and the jug of oil did not run dry.” God provides for his children, at times from the most unexpected places. One local couple remembers a time of recent, practical need. A single, ten dollar bill was all they had left, and they needed groceries for their young family. A day or so later, even as the wife was preparing the last of their modest supply, they found a generous basket of food had been left at their back door. Though they never discovered who had provided, they knew God had directed a Good Samaritan to care for them just as Elijah had cared for a poor widow and her son.
