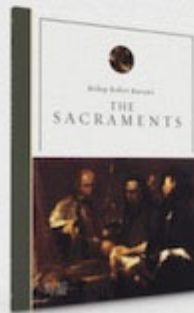

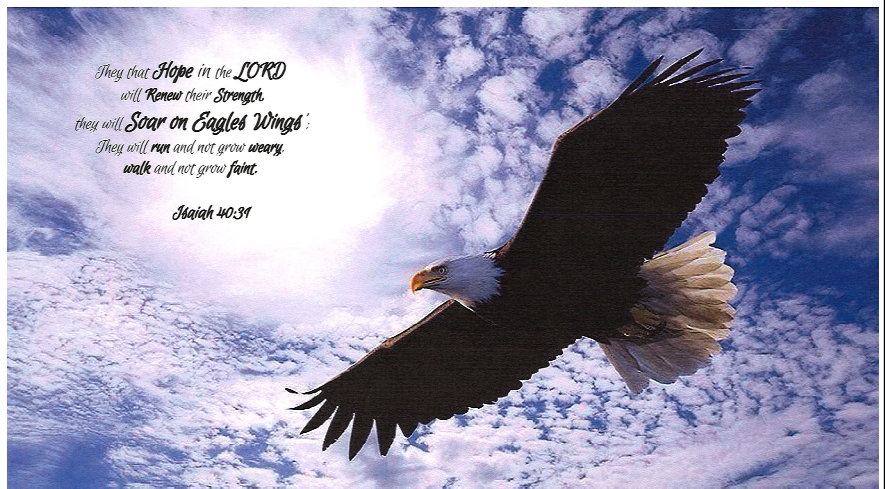

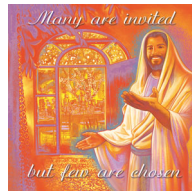

God Revealed to the Nations

What wonderful images we have today of the reign of God! Isaiah speaks to us of a great feast—a heavenly feast—a feast of abundance with rich foods and choice wines. It is the Lord's own affair, Isaiah explains, when God will unite all nations, dry every tear, and destroy death forever. Then, too, will the entire earth rejoice in the Lord and bask in God's saving grace.

Jesus speaks of heaven in terms of a feast as well. Here, the kingdom of heaven is likened to a king's wedding feast given for his son. This is a feast of abundance also, with the fattened cattle prepared just so. But many of the people invited don't want to come, so the king invites anyone who would honor his son by their presence there. And Paul tells us that whether we live abundantly or in humble circumstances, we can do all things in the Lord who strengthens us.

Catholic Practices Invite Your Service and Always Have

Next week, we will enter the Stewardship of Ministry phase of our **Total Stewardship** program. When we gather, we celebrate the Eucharist, invest ourselves in times of prayer and teaching, and each of those ministries of the Church invites your ministry participation, as parishioners *Wholly Committed* to serve in Christ's name. Please begin to think of ways you might invest your gifts, talents and interests, and ask how you might serve "in the name of the Lord Jesus."

We read the history of the early Church and discover that our Catholic sacraments are rooted in beloved, ancient practices. Members of the first century Church "devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers" (Acts 2:42). In the Mass, our focus is on the Paschal Lamb, Christ present in the Eucharist. Ensuring we know such blessing invites the participation, support and ministry of dozens and dozens of parishioners each service, some whose contributions are public and obvious, others less so. Whether our service is public or private, overt or unnoticed, we serve to the glory of God, ministering in the name of Jesus, that we might affirm our Catholic faith, *Wholly Committed* to God.
